Annual Report Fiscal Year 2022 July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022

Middlesex Conservation District had a productive, interesting and challenging fiscal year 2022. We faced the challenge of continuing to operate while the world was in lockdown due to COVID. This affected most of our activities.

- We developed the Long Range Plan that includes the history of soil and water use in Middlesex County, and work that we have done for the past 75 years. We have a few copies here tonight if you would like to read it Thank you to everyone who worked on the Long Range Plan. A special thank you to Patrick Hearn who spearheaded creating the Plan.
- The district put on several workshops, including a soils and no-till equipment demo with Farmer Dave and NRCS, a People-Plant-Pollinator Solution Workshop with Dr. Gegear of Umass Dartmouth, Grow Your Own Mushrooms Workshop with Fat Moon Mushrooms, and a Wild Edible Plant Ramble with Russ Cohen. We thank you, Farmer Dave, NRCS, Russ, the Acton Arboretum, Dr. Gegear, and Fat Moon Mushrooms.
- We used Zoom for workshops and board meetings. A lot more people were able to participate in our workshops, including some international attendees. At lest one workshop had over 100 registrations.
- We went live with our new website in January 2022, thanks to Scott Lewis, our webmaster. Susan Thomas worked hard with Scott to refine the website's functionality and she also helped with troubleshooting,
- Our Spring Plant Sale in 2022 was a success, and in part we provided native plants that would feed our customers and their landscapes for years to come. We thank our many volunteers who helped out, including Nate Eckman, who used some of his natives for his trail restoration project at Hopkinton Land Trust. We donated remaining food plants to Boston Area Gleaners.

We also worked with Woods End Lab and Grisha Maziya of Shady Corner Farm to do compost testing. Thank you, Grisha and Woods End Lab!
- Dick Gelpke, Liz McGuire, and Dave Williams started work on our 75th year celebration, part of which is being presented tonight.
- Sue Thomas was our District Administrator. Carolyn Wirth was our Plant Sale Coordinator, We are very thankful for the help of each of them.
- We had much attrition by the end of FY2022. Some people moved away for better opportunities elsewhere or found better opportunities in the area. We wish the best to all of them, and thank them for all their efforts with MCD.
- We wish to give Susan Thomas a special thank you for all her hard work
- Our financial details are here tonight, but the formal presentation is still at the auditor. When the financial review is ready, we will make it available to anyone who needs it, such as our state officials, or others who wants see it.
- Moving forward, we now have a new district administrator, Andrea Grossman. She joined us in January 2023, bring a lot of energy to our organization. As there has been a pause in plant sales, the district is taking the present time to reconfigure our sales to better support district goals. We will focus plants to help local pollinators and to otherwise help our area deal with climate change.
- Tonight we have four presently nominated candidates for positions on the Board of Supervisors. In addition, we will entertain nominations from the floor.
